Commercial Driver License Requirements

All customers applying for an original CDL or CLP must present one of the documents below to **establish Florida residency.**

- A current Florida Class E driver license or Florida Identification card held for a period more than six (6) months.
- A lease agreement in the customer's name that has been in place for a period more than six (6) consecutive months.
- A current residential mortgage in the customer's name signed more than six (6) months ago.
- A current residential deed in the customer's name signed more than six (6) months ago.
- A Florida Voter Registration Card
- A Declaration of Domicile filed with the Clerk of Courts
- Homestead tax exemption filing on property in this state.

Drivers applying for or **changing the address** on a CDL or CLP will be required to present two (2) residential address documents from the lists below. At least one (1) proof of address must be submitted from list A.

DOT MEDICAL CARD - If required please provide a legible copy of your valid DOT Medical Card. Note: All DOT Medical Cards must be current and kept on file with DHSMV. Failure to do so will result in a disqualification of your commercial driver license.

<u>List A</u>

- A recent lease or rental agreement with a term of six (6) months or greater in the drivers name.
- Current Florida Voter Registration Card
- Valid Florida Vehicle/Vessel Registration or Title
- · Current homeowners insurance policy or bill
- Current utility bill **
- Recent phone bill (cell or landline)**
- Recent internet bill **
- Latest property tax bill
- Mortgage deed for property in Florida
- ** Must be dated within the last 60 days**

<u>List B</u>

- Latest W2 form or 1099 form
- Recent bank statement **
- Recent credit card statement **
- · Latest military orders or documents
- Recent pay stub **
- Recent official government documents **

Note: If you are unable to provide a proof of residential address from list A, you must provide a Declaration of Domicile filed with the Clerk of Court pursuant to Florida Statutes section 222.17 AND one (1) proof of residential documents from list B.
